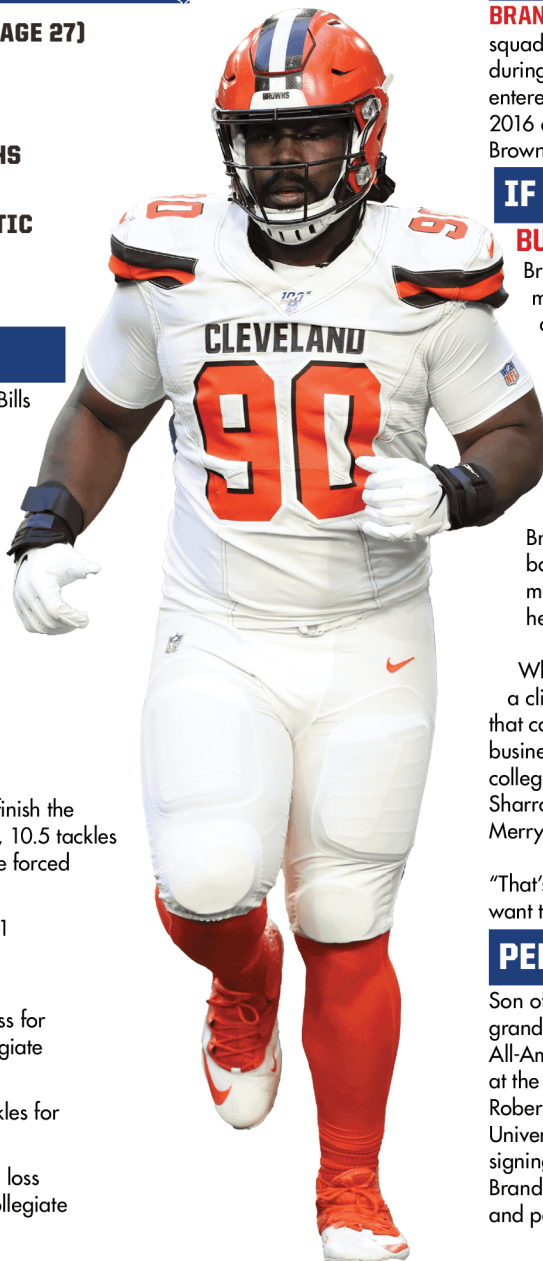

SHOUTOUTS

- Played his first game in a Bills uniform vs. NE (11/1/20).
- Spent the 2019 season with the Cleveland Browns, where he played in four games.
- Recorded three tackles during the 2019 season.
- While at Florida Atlantic, named the 2015 Comeback Player of the Year after returning from a knee injury in 2014. He would finish the season totaling 35 tackles, 10.5 tackles for loss, five sacks and one forced fumble.
- Recorded 130 tackles in 41 games from 2012-15.
- Logged 27.0 tackles for loss for 152 yards during his collegiate career.
- Had a career-high 51 tackles for the Owls in 2013.
- Recorded 13.5 sacks for a loss of 102 yards during his collegiate career.
