



BOBBY JOHNSON

11th YEAR IN THE NFL
4th YEAR WITH THE BILLS

Bobby Johnson re-joined the Buffalo Bills in 2019 after being announced as the team's offensive line coach. He has 25 years of coaching experience between college and NFL.

COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

2019-present: (Buffalo Bills)

- Oversaw a rebuilt offensive line that included four new starters.

2018: (Indianapolis Colts)

- Spent a season as the Colts' assistant offensive line coach, where he helped the team to rank eighth in rushing yards per game in the NFL.

2015-17: (Oakland Raiders)

- Served as the Raiders' tight ends coach for three seasons.
- In 2017, his unit of Jared Cook, Clive Walford and Lee Smith, combined for 71 receptions for 844 yards and two touchdowns.

2013-14: (Detroit Lions)

- Spent the 2013 season as the Lions tight ends coach, producing one of the best duos in the NFL in TE Brandon Pettigrew and undrafted rookie TE Joseph Fauria, combining for nine TD receptions.
- Moved to assistant offensive line coach for the Lions in 2014.

2012: (Jacksonville Jaguars)

- Served as the tight ends coach where he helped veteran TE Mercedes Lewis to his second 50-reception season and his third 500-yard season, while also recording his second-highest touchdown total with four scores.

2010-11: (Buffalo Bills)

- Spent two seasons as the Bills assistant offensive line coach. Under his guidance, the Bills' offensive line ranked tied for seventh in the NFL from 2010-11 with just 57 sacks allowed.

The team also averaged 4.6 rushing yards per attempt over those two seasons, good for sixth in the league.

2005-09: (Indiana)

- From 2005-09, Johnson was the offensive line coach at Indiana, where he developed two NFL linemen in G/T Rodger Saffold, a second-round selection of the St. Louis Rams in 2010, and G James Brewer, a New York Giants' fourth-round pick in 2011.

1999-2004: (Miami (OH))

- Spent his final year at Miami of Ohio as the team's offensive line coach after having worked with the tight ends the previous four seasons.
- During his five-year tenure, the RedHawks were 36-5 when outrushing the opponent.

1995-1998: (Akron)

- Johnson spent four years at the University of Akron, the first two as a graduate assistant (1995-96) and then as the Zips' defensive line coach (1997-98).

COLLEGE

- Played tackle at Miami (Ohio), starting on the offensive line from 1992-94. Helped the RedHawks average 156.7 rushing yards per game in 1992 and 174.4 rushing yards per game in 1994.
- Graduated with a degree in Health Appraisal and Sports Organization.

PERSONAL

- A native of Akron, Ohio, Johnson and his wife, Kristen, have two daughters, Madilyn and Olivia.
