



BRIAN DABOLL

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Brian Daboll is in his fourth season as the Bills offensive coordinator. A native of Buffalo, Daboll was named the 2020 AP Assistant Coach of the Year. Won a national championship as the offensive coordinator at Alabama in 2017. Daboll coached in New England for a total of 11 seasons and won five Super Bowl titles as an assistant (XXXVI, XXXVIII, XXXIX, XLIX and LI).



COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

2018-present: Buffalo Bills

- Earned AP Assistant Coach of the Year honors in 2020.
- Leads the Bills offense and has overseen the development of QB Josh Allen into an All-Pro QB.
- The Bills offense ranked second overall in both yards (396.4) and points (31.3) per game in 2020. Improved the Bills scoring production by 11.7 points per game from 2019 to 2020.

2017: Alabama Crimson Tide

- Under Daboll, Alabama's offense scored in 49 consecutive quarters during the 2017 season marking the NCAA's longest streak since 2005.
- Alabama led the Southeastern Conference in scoring offense (37.9 ppg) and No. 4 in total offense (449.7).

2013-16: New England Patriots

- Coached tight ends as Rob Gronkowski earned Associated Press first All-Pro honors in 2014 and 2015

2012: Kansas City Chiefs

- In Daboll's offense, RB Jamaal Charles finished fourth in the NFL in rushing (1,509 yards) and earned Pro Bowl honors

2011: Miami Dolphins

- Daboll led the Dolphins offense as they produced a 1,000-yard rusher (Reggie Bush) and 1,000-yard receiver (Brandon Marshall) in the same season for the first time in franchise history.

2009-2010: Cleveland Browns

- The Browns ranked eighth in the NFL in rushing offense averaging 130.4 yards per game in 2010

2007-2008: New York Jets

- As quarterbacks coach, Daboll helped tutor Brett Favre produce his second-highest completion percentage of his career (65.7) in his Pro Bowl season in New York.

2000-2006: New England Patriots

- Spent 2000-2001 as a defensive assistant. Moved to wide receivers coach from 2002-2006.
- Helped Deion Branch earn Super Bowl XXXIX MVP honors in the Patriots win over Philadelphia following the 2004 season. Branch was the first wide receiver to earn MVP since San Francisco's Jerry Rice in 1988.

1998-1999: Michigan State

- Served as a graduate assistant on Nick Saban's staff

1997: William & Mary

- Volunteer assistant the same season current Bills head coach Sean McDermott concluded his college football playing career

COLLEGE

- Graduated from the University of Rochester in 1997 and was a two-year starter at safety for the Yellow Jackets.

PERSONAL

- A native of West Seneca, NY he and his wife Beth have six children: Mark, Christian, Aiden, Haven, Avery and Luke. Attended St. Francis High School.
