WIDE RECEIVERS

A former NFL receiver with the Eagles, 49ers and Chiefs and a second lieutenant in the United States Air Force, Chad Hall is in his 5th season with the Bills and third as the wide receivers coach, after being promoted from offensive assistant in 2019.



COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

2017-present: (Bills)

- Oversaw a receivers room in 2020 that took the Buffalo offense to new heights, helping both Stefon Diggs and Cole Beasley earn All-Pro honors. Diggs set franchise records and led the NFL with 127 receptions and 1,535 receiving yards on the season. Diggs also tied a franchise record with seven 100-yard games in his first season working with Hall.

NFL CAREER

- Played wide receiver for the Philadelphia Eagles (2010-12), San Francisco 49ers (2012-13), Kansas City Chiefs (2013). Played for the 49ers NFC Championship squad in 2012.
- Hall accumulated 15 receptions for 144 yards and two touchdowns during his NFL career.

COLLEGE

- Played running back at the United States Air Force Academy for three years.
- The only player in the country to lead his team in rushing and receiving during his senior year, finishing third in the nation in all-purpose yards.
- Named the Mountain West Conference Offensive Player of the Year in 2007.

PERSONAL

- Born in 1986 and hails from Atlanta, GA. After graduating from Wesleyan School in Norcross, GA, Hall was recruited to play quarterback but was soon converted to running back.
- Inducted into the Gwinnett Sports Hall of Fame in 2017.
- From 2008–2009, Hall served in the United States Air Force as a second lieutenant. He was based in Hill Air Force Base in Utah as a maintenance officer, assigned to the 388th Maintenance Group.
- Married the former Rose Pierce-Tenney in May of 2018. They have a daughter named Penelope.
