Ryan Wendell joined the Buffalo Bills in 2019 as a coaching assistant. In the 2020 season, Wendell was promoted to assistant offensive line. Prior to joining the Bills, he played center in the NFL for nine years.



COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

2019-present: (Buffalo Bills)

- In 2021, assisted in guiding an offense that scored 476 points, which was the second-most in the NFL during the 2021 regular season.
- Spent one season as a coaching assistant prior to getting promoted to assistant offensive line in 2020.
- In 2020, helped lead the Bills to the team's first division title since 1996. Was a part of an offensive coaching staff that led the AFC by scoring 31.3 points per game.

PLAYER

- Played nine seasons as an offensive lineman for the New England Patriots (2008-15) and Carolina Panthers (2016). He started at RG for the Patriots during their championship run in the 2014-15 season.
- Including special teams, he played in a total of 1,379 snaps which was the most of any NFL player during the 2012 season.
- Prior to the 2015 season, Wendell was named a team captain for the first time in his career.

PERSONAL

- Originally from Pomona, California, Wendell played college football at Fresno State.
- Wendell and his wife, Meredith, have two daughters named Cali and Kyra.
